The organization's members decide to be devoted to serving the poor & and disadvantaged community irrespective of sex, caste, & and creed and to create a new & and just society by empowering the people to be self-reliant through training, capacity building, skill gradation, and other development activities.

Also to develop leadership qualities to bring social change and to create a classless, oppression-free village based on non-violence and universal brotherhood.

Chetna Education serves all the deprived humanity without distinction of race, caste & or religion. Presently the organization is working in and around the rural area of Ramgarh & Ranchi District in the state of Jharkhand

The working strategy of the organization

The organization used to select the area after visiting the area & and diagnosis of the problem may depend upon the information collected by way of observation questionnaire, discussion with the local leaders, discussion with the main people, etc. Project formulation is done by the expert of the organization & and participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) has been adopted for making any decision about the program activities. During the implementation stage, the society used to direct implementation with the help of the community or village committee. Monitoring and evaluation of the progress and impact of the program depend upon the nature of the projects. Our working strategies are based on the following points below here: -

OUR APPROACH

Our primary approach is to poverty alleviation through transformational development which is called the 'area survey program' (ASP). Each ASP focuses on a geographical area and covers Disability, the Underprivileged, and Old age & and it is a long-term involvement of a minimum of 10 years, rooted in the community and in partnership with civil society, NGOs, and the Government. We consciously focus on people, groups, and areas in our country that are socio-economically vulnerable. Hence the majority of the ASPs in rural and isolated tribal areas especially focus on the unreached, marginalized, and disadvantaged people.



Major Achievements

- During this year more than 120 families have changed their water-related hygiene behaviors. The family members now utilize water pots, and hand wash after defecation.
- Children of schools and AWCs have again been targeted under hygiene practices but results have not been found due to its closure.
- 3 water sources have been renovated for safe drinking water in the operational areas under Ramgarh district whereas 12 platforms and others were also repaired in the area for access to the community on safe drinking water.
- Construction of nearly 110 compost Pits to train the villagers in the method of decomposition of organic waste material and convert it into usable fertilizer to promote vegetable production in rural areas ensuring health and economic sustainability.
- To conserve the rainwater and to mitigate the drought situation 2 water harvesting tanks have been renovated through the gram sabha under Chetna Education. It is expected to cover, more than 100 acres of land that have been irrigated to protect the paddy crop from drought.

Consumer Awareness

Our NGO has been working towards consumer awareness for the past year, and we are pleased to share our annual report on the activities we conducted.



Activities:

Community-women and adolescents also initiated proper menstrual hygiene behaviors.

This hygiene and sanitation and related changes in behavior resulted in decreased disease incidence in the community. The community also prepared soak pits, and garbage pits and also initiated the proper use of the drained water used in the kitchen garden



Rural Development

Our team and volunteers organized health check-up camps for poor old people.

In order to fulfill the basic needs of the rural people, public toilets were made and the importance of cleanliness was explained to them.

Numerous activities were implemented in the field of agriculture including the use of organic fertilizers.

Various trees were planted and its importance was explained to the people



Mask Production During the "COVID-19"

During the COVID-19 Pandemic, mask production was done by the Self Help Groups. 5000 masks were produced by the SHG for the purpose to help the local community.

SHG's members started production through two machines with the support and direction of "The Chetna Education". With the production of masks, SHG's members and their families also gained economic stability during the pandemic economic crisis.



Relief Activities During "COVID-19"

Chetna Education has conducted Awareness Programs in Rural areas such as Ramgarh blocks and Urban areas to maintain "Social-Distancing" and follow the guidelines given by the government such as wearing masks and sanitizing their hands at regular intervals. We also conducted Cleanliness Awareness Programs among the people of Society. Distribution of Dry Ration, Masks, and Sanitizers was done by the volunteers Of our NGO. We have inspired and made people aware of the benefits and Importance of taking Vaccines. Our Volunteers made the way easier for people To reach their nearest vaccination centers. Our NGO also helped out Migrant Workers to reach their destination safely.

Annual Activities Report on Art and Culture Program by N.G.O

Health Camp

Chetna Education has conducted regular health education camps in most of the target villages by involving the local health personnel of the Govt. department. As a result, regular health checkups of children under 0-5 and pregnant mothers got iron and folic acid as well as immunization during the Pulse Polio vaccination campaign. The target area of Chetna Education is malaria-prone.

The people are required to adopt blood tests on the occasion of any sort of illness.

Now, it has

been possible as a result of their awareness in the field of health care. Complement the Public health services by organizing health camps in the intervention area where the reach of government services is still poor.

Increase awareness of the community on health care practices and disease prevention with the help of counseling by doctors and health personnel. We have organized 2 health camps during the year in two areas of our working field. We have organized those camps with the collaboration of the government health department i.e. Chetna Education Mobile health unit, ANMs, etc.



Environmental Awareness

Camp

Chetna Education took an active part in the Environmental Awareness Program, Sustainable Livelihood of Poor Peoples through Awareness Generation about Promotion of village forest in Ramgarh District. Chetna Education has the pleasure of participating in the environmental theme for the year "Sustainable Livelihood from Forest. Padyatra, workshop on the music and Plantation of Medicinal Plants, Adoption of the plantation at large scale by each individual, Protection of forest in the surrounding village, and Promotion of organic manures held under the programmed activities. Coverage of 5 villages of Ramgarh district was done.



Agriculture Training

A Village level training has been organized in Ramgarh District. In this meeting discussion on sustainable agriculture and SR9 technology i.e. seed processing & preserving, benefits of organic fertilizer, preparation & use of organic fertilizer, use of organic pesticides, and the difference between SR9 and traditional farming had been discussed with the participants. As far as the outcome concerned is the villager's enhanced knowledge regarding agriculture promotion and SR9 technology. They also know the difference between SR9 and traditional farming. In this regard, the Chetna Education has expertise in SR9 technology for sustainable agriculture, and to meet food scarcity. As we all know that this technology is proven its specialty in low-cost and high-productivity technology of agriculture, so keeping in mind the livelihood development of the poor people in the targeted area, we have organized one-day training on "System of Rice Intensification (SR9)" in the targeted area, where a total number of 156 farmers participated. Out of the total 156 participants, 115 farmers agreed to adopt the SR9 method this year for the cultivation



Road Safety Awareness Campaign

"It is necessary that everyone should follow traffic rules. All those rebels who don't care to follow the rules are in constant danger. It is our moral duty to follow road safety rules".

Our organization also gave information about the "Motor Vehicle Act and Traffic Rules" and also said that the best way to keep others and yourself safe is to follow proper traffic rules. Whenever you drive a car follow the traffic rules, It is important to wear a helmet while driving a two-wheeler and obey the traffic lights to avoid accidents. One should always wear a seat belt while driving a car. Avoid rash driving as fast speed is the core reason for accidents. Always carry all the paper in the vehicle.

To improve the traffic in the city, the team of traffic police gave their WhatsApp number and helpline number and also said if anyone breaks the traffic rules just make a video and send it to them.

The road safety program by our NGO has been actively working towards promoting road safety and reducing accidents on the road. Our program aims to educate and raise awareness among people about safe driving practices and encourage them to follow road safety rules and regulations.

Conclusion:

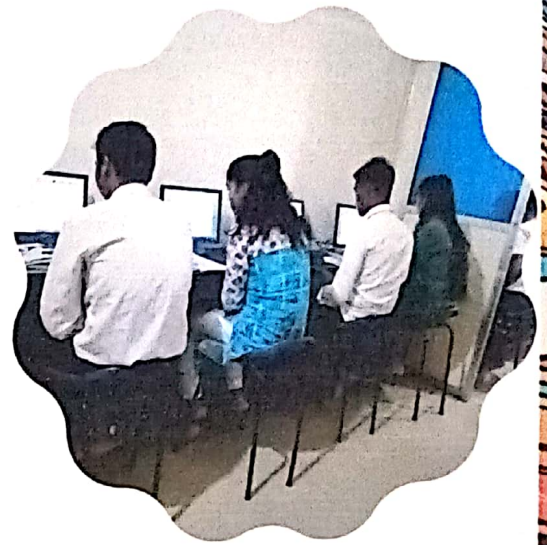
In conclusion, we are proud of the work performed by our road safety program in the past year. We hope to continue our efforts towards promoting road safety and reducing accidents on the road in the future.

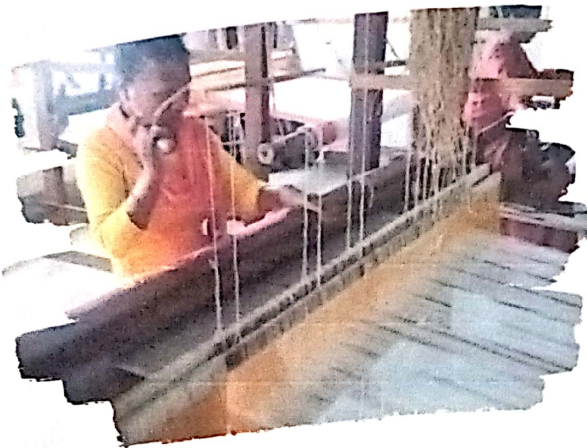

School Education Activities

We did this School education activities training program with 3 schools, which included 800 students, in which we increase their learning and concentration power of their mind. They also gained many ideas on how to focus on their study in a perfect manner. The need of the hour is that elementary education should be universalized, secondary education should be vocationalized and higher education should be expanded. Discussion on the universalization of elementary education had been a talk of policymakers even before independence. However, the Britishers kept the policy deliberately postponing it. In this regard, Mahatma Gandhi framed his policy of Basic Education in 1937 and drew a plan to educate all the students. This can be said to be the first proper scheme towards its universalization. Though many plans had been made to implement this scheme, special concentrated efforts were made after independence only.



Vocational Training Program

We did this local training program with 950 people, which included 240 students and 710 people, in which we got students and people enrolled in the industry in Ramgarh City. Vocational Education is based on occupation and employment and it is the need of the hour for every country to have a strong vocational education system. It can be defined as skilled-based education. Vocational Education helps in Economic growth. The Indian education system recognizes the role of education and particularly Vocational Education. National Council for Vocational Training, an advisory body, was set up by the Government of India plays an important role in the implementation of Vocational Education in India. Although there are lots many areas in which India is facing problems in Vocational Education Implementation. This article throws light upon the scope, problem areas, and government's role in Vocational Education Implementation.

ST/SC & Minorities Awareness Program

We organized ST/SC and Minority Program in 16 villages with 7000 people, which includes all villages. People here were very happy and participated in this program in the Ramgarh district. India is a welfare State, committed to the welfare and development of its people and of vulnerable sections in particular. Socially disadvantaged groups of SC/ ST have received special focus over the years for their social and economic advancement. The government has taken several steps for formulating appropriate policies needed to design and implement various welfare programs for achieving the objective of creating a favorable environment to ensure speedy socio-economic development of SC/ ST's.



Program For Adolescent Girls

School girls at the government girls higher secondary school organization Chetna Education organized a menstruation awareness program for school girls.

At the end of the program, all the 200 teachers and adolescent girls present were distributed nashita and sanitary pad



SFHG Formation & Strengthening & Empowerment

Nearly 305 Women Self Help Groups have been linked with the nationalized banks of the respective field area. Around 305 SFHG members have been directly linked up with banks and have savings and credit accounts. Moreover, nearly 300 Women, SFHGs have been provided loans by the banks for Income generation Activities for economic self-reliance. have been initiated in the project area. The organization is also trying to provide each and every group by the banks with Schemes to initiate on a much wider scale and profitable manner. The organization intervened in economic activity for the women to make them economically self-reliant and to raise their standard of living through raising their income level - which altogether will promote them to participate in all sorts of development activities. for women of different villages have been initiated by our agency according to their skills and needs, which are the following: - Vermicompost, Tailoring, Bamboo Basket making, Zari craft, Mushroom cultivation, Duckery, Pollutery, Floweryclature, etc. Presently. Women are taking a keen interest in manufacturing these products. These women SFHG group members belong to the ST, SC, and OBC Category. SSVS is organizing meetings and awareness-building activities about saving and Credit, Immunization, Health and Hygiene, Education, etc for these women as well as youth and adolescents associated with these women's families. All sorts of information and inputs are being delivered to them to promote their self-esteem, self-respect, and sustainability regarding their socioeconomic development

National Festival Program

National festival programs i.e. Independent Day, Republic Day, Holi Milan, Dashahara, and Deepawali have been organized by the Society in different Blocks of the Ramgarh District of Jharkhand State. Cultural programs were also organized on Independent Day, Republic Day, Holi Milan, Dashahara, and Deepawali. Shanki was also organized by the cultural team. 128 Nos. of participants took part in the celebration.



Child Labour awareness

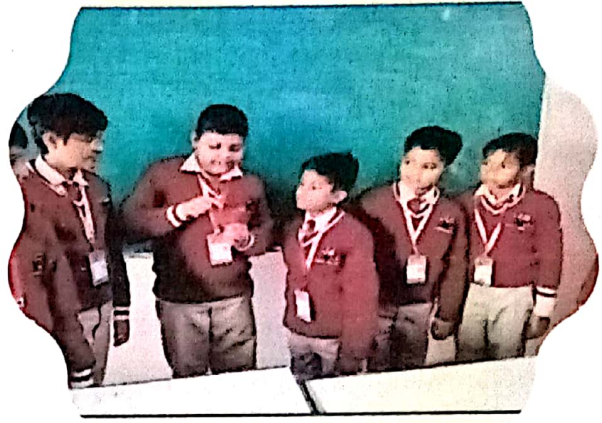


Awareness Of HIV & AIDS.
